**Defendant in Double Homicide Enters Plea;  
Receives Life Without Parole Sentences**

State v. Gary Kyle Marshall 2009-CR-2535

Today, **Gary Kyle Marshall**, 37, plead guilty to multiple felonies relating to the July 2009 bludgeoning deaths of his mother and father, Susie and David Marshall in their Union, Ohio home.

The defendant plead guilty as charged to all counts in the indictment:

- Two counts of Aggravated Murder
- Two counts of Aggravated Robbery
- Two counts of Felonious Assault
- One count of Grand Theft of a motor vehicle

Pursuant to a plea agreement in the case, the Court sentenced the defendant to two consecutive terms of life in prison without the possibility of parole. The defendant was also sentenced to 33 ½ additional years in prison which was ordered to be served consecutively to his two life sentences. As a result, death penalty specifications will not be pursued. Moreover, as part of the plea, the defendant agreed to waive his rights to all appeals.

Montgomery County Prosecuting Attorney Mat Heck, Jr. said, "As a result of these pleas, we were able to remove a violent criminal from the streets and guarantee that he will remain in prison for the rest of his life, without the possibility of ever being released."

Heck continued, "There is nothing more devastating than losing a loved one to violent crime. That loss is made even more painful when a family member is responsible for the death. It is our hope that as a result of these pleas, the surviving family members and friends of the victims can begin to find closure and continue their healing process."

Heck added, "I would also like to commend the Union Police Department for all their hard work and efforts in bringing this defendant to justice in this case."
