Judge Hall joined the Court of Appeals in 2011. He was a Judge on the Montgomery County Common Pleas Court, General Division, from 1999 until assuming the bench on the Court of Appeals.

Judge Hall received his B.S. from the University of Dayton in 1975 and his J.D., *Summa Cum Laude*, from the University of Dayton School of Law in 1979. Judge Hall was also an Associate Editor for the University of Dayton Law Review. He was admitted to the Ohio Bar and Federal Bar, Southern District of Ohio, in 1979, and to the Florida Bar in 1983.

Judge Hall spent 20 years in the private practice of law, most recently as senior partner in the firm of Hall, Tucker, Fullenkamp & Singer. In 1997-1998, he served as a Montgomery County District Court Judge. Judge Hall was a City of Dayton Police Officer from 1970-1976.

Judge Hall is a member of the Ohio and Dayton Bar Associations, Florida Bar Association, and the American Bar Association. He previously served as Treasurer of the Dayton Bar Association and President of the Carl D. Kessler Inns of Court. He is a past-President of the Montgomery County Trial Lawyers Association

Judge Hall was the first lawyer in his office to use a computer and has an interest in the use of technology. The record in his trial court was kept with an audio/video system his entire time on that bench. As Administrative Judge of the Common Pleas Court, he was instrumental in the start of that court's fully integrated e-filing system.
