Dayton Man Sentenced to 26 Years-to-Life for November Homicide

State v. Bryson Williams, 2016-CR-4051

DAYTON, OH (6/21/2017) – Prosecuting Attorney Mat Heck, Jr. announced today that **BRYSON TYRONE WILLIAMS**, 19, of Dayton, was sentenced to a total of 26 years-to-life in prison for the shooting death of Terion Dixon that occurred on November 11, 2016.

On the night of Friday, November 11, 2016, the defendant fired a number of rounds at the victim, striking and killing 21-year-old Terion Lamb Dixon, of Clayton, who was standing outside a friend's car in the 1700 block of Germantown Street.

On January 13, 2017, the defendant was indicted on:

- Two counts of Murder
- Two counts of Felonious Assault
- One count of Discharge of a Firearm On or Near Prohibited Premises

All of the counts included 3-year firearm specifications.

On June 14, 2017, after a trial, the jury found the defendant guilty as charged on all counts and specifications.

The defendant was sentenced to 15 years-to-life for the murder conviction, plus an additional 3 years for the firearm specification, which by law must be served consecutively. In addition, the defendant was sentenced to 8 years in prison for discharging the firearm over a roadway, which was also ordered to be served consecutively.

Prosecutor Heck continued, "We believe the sentence ordered today by Judge Skelton is wholly appropriate and deserved. People who commit murder should be incarcerated for as long as possible."
