

2021 CoC Competition OH-505 CoC Priority Order

Renewal Project Priority Order

Renewal projects will be ranked in the following order based on their primary target population, housing type, and renewal project application score.

1. Chronically Homeless Single Adults – Permanent Supportive Housing & Safe Haven
2. Youth 18-24 years (unaccompanied and youth head of households)– Rapid Rehousing and Transitional Housing
3. Families with Children and Single Adults – Rapid Rehousing
4. PSH Projects primarily serving non-chronic single adults or families with children.

System grants, including the CoC's Coordinated Entry and HMIS grants, will be placed as the lowest projects that are fully funded within Tier 1. Well-performing renewal projects *that continue to fill a need* in the CoC will be prioritized above new projects, with the exception of reallocated projects that expand the capacity of existing CoC projects. These will be ranked just below the CoC project they are expanding.

Reallocated Projects Priority Order

1. Expansion of Housing First I-IV
2. Coordinated Entry Expansion

CoC Bonus Projects Priority Order

1. Coordinated Entry Expansion
2. Rapid Rehousing

DV Bonus Projects Priority Order

1. Coordinated Entry for DV Expansion
2. Joint TH-RRH for DV Survivors
3. Rapid Rehousing for DV Survivors

New Projects – Additional Criteria

To increase the diversity of providers and the capacity of the CoC, preference will be given to qualified providers who are not currently receiving CoC funds in the OH-505 CoC.

Bonus points will be given to new housing projects where at least 25% of the units are funded with a source other than CoC or ESG dollars. Bonus points will also be given to new housing projects where at least 25% of the total project cost will be covered by a partnering healthcare organization.

Project applicant and all subrecipients must have the expertise and capacity to serve the proposed target population and be at full implementation within three months of signing a grant agreement with HUD.

PH-RRH projects must incorporate the core components of Rapid Rehousing: housing identification, rent and move-in assistance, and housing-focused case management and services, including targeted employment assistance in a scattered site, flexible model without preconditions. Resources and services should be tailored to the needs of each participant.
