### Montgomery County to Offer Free Household Hazardous Waste Disposal in Clay Township

*Event Aimed at Protecting Public Health and the Environment*

Dayton, Ohio (August 1, 2016) – The Montgomery County Solid Waste District, in cooperation with Clay Township, is sponsoring a Household Hazardous Waste collection event on Saturday, August 6, 2016 from 9 a.m. to noon at the Clay Township offices, 8207 Arlington Rd., Clay Township, Ohio 45309. This event is free of charge and open to all Montgomery County residents. Proof of residency is required.

“Disposing of hazardous household chemicals in a safe and responsible manner protects the health of our citizens and the environment,” said Montgomery County Commission President Judy Dodge. “The Montgomery County Solid Waste District offers these valuable free services to improve the quality of life in our county.”

Items that are accepted during the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day include: herbicides, pesticides, insecticides, mercury, flammable liquids, fire extinguishers, household propane cylinders, household cleaners, pool chemicals, paints and solvents, and batteries and light bulbs of all types.

Pharmaceuticals, explosives and radioactive wastes are not accepted. Absolutely no hazardous wastes from businesses, schools, organizations, or commercial entities will be accepted.
