**Three Sentenced for Deadly Home Invasion**  
*State v. Daylequan Arnold, Deon Harris, and King Turner, 2020-CR-825*

**DAYTON, OH (01/27/2022)** – Prosecuting Attorney Mat Heck, Jr. announced that **DAYLEQUAN S. ARNOLD**, 25, **DEON M. HARRIS, Jr.**, 29, and **KING A. TURNER**, 23, all of Dayton, were sentenced after being convicted on counts in connection to a home invasion that occurred on Saturday, December 21, 2019, in which two victims were fatally shot.

During the early morning hours of Saturday, December 21, 2019, Dayton police were dispatched on a report of a shooting at a residence in the 900 block of Ethel Avenue in Dayton. Upon arrival, they located a deceased victim, who had been shot multiple times, later identified as Frankie McGee, Jr. In another room, a second shooting victim was found and was transported to the hospital. The second victim, identified as Christopher Huntley, died from his injuries on December 28, 2019.

The investigation, including video surveillance and other forensic evidence, revealed the defendants forced their way into the home in order to commit a burglary. During the commission of the burglary, both victims were shot multiple times.

On June 3, 2020, the defendants were indicted by the Montgomery County Grand Jury.

On April 14, 2020, a fourth co-defendant, **MALIK A. OGLETREE**, was indicted and entered a plea of guilty as charged to two counts of Aggravated Murder and Tampering with Evidence. On January 14, 2022, he was sentenced to a total of 24 years-to-life in prison.

On October 29, 2021, defendant Arnold entered a guilty plea to two counts of Aggravated Murder. Today, he was sentenced to a total of 28 years to life in prison.

On January 13, 2022, after a trial, the jury found defendant Turner guilty as charged on all counts and specifications. Yesterday, he was sentenced to a total of 77 years-to-life in prison. The jury also found defendant Harris guilty as charged on counts of murder, aggravated burglary, felonious assault, and having weapons while under disability. Yesterday, he was sentenced to a total of 41 years-to-life in prison.
