Convicted Felons Sentenced – Going Back to Prison

State v. Tyler Lewis and Daylen Marshall 2014-CR-3898

DAYTON, OH (4/13/2015) – Prosecuting Attorney Mat Heck, Jr. announced today that two co-defendants, 24-year-old **Tyler Jamarr Lewis**, of Trotwood, and 22-year-old **Daylen Devontae Marshall**, of Dayton, were sentenced for their convictions stemming from an incident that occurred downtown on November 12, 2014.

On November 12, 2014, Dayton Police were called to the Dayton Grand Hotel on West Third Street, in downtown Dayton, on a disturbance. When officers went to the defendants' room, defendant Marshall answered the door and immediately dropped a firearm. The officers checked both defendant's IDs and discovered they were both on post-release control, having recently been released from prison. During a pat-down, defendant Lewis was found to be in possession of heroin.

Defendant Marshall was convicted in 2009 of aggravated robbery and was sentenced to five years in prison. He was released from prison in June, 2014. In this new case, he was sentenced to serve 18 months in prison.

Defendant Lewis was convicted in 2008 of aggravated robbery and was sentenced to six years in prison, plus he was ordered to serve five years of post-release control. In this new case, he was sentenced to 18 months in prison, plus an additional 1,605 days for the remainder of his post-release control time.

Prosecutor Heck continued, "These defendants serve as a reminder of why we expect defendants to serve their entire sentence, and then serve their entire probation or parole period. Clearly for these defendants, being on post-release control was not an incentive to obey the law."
