Dayton Man Indicted in Decade Old Murder Case

State v. Theodore Satterwhite, 2014-CR-4075

DAYTON, OH (04/30/2015) – Prosecuting Attorney Mat Heck, Jr. announced today that 33 year old **Theodore S. Satterwhite, III**, of Dayton, has been indicted for a homicide and shooting that occurred in 2005.

On Thursday, November 3, 2005, the victims, 22 year old Roscoe Shipp and his friend, were leaving JP's Bar and Grill at 514 North Gettysburg Avenue in Dayton when they were approached by three masked men, brandishing firearms. The three attackers opened fire. Shipp was struck multiple times and died. The other victim was also struck, but he was able to flee to a safe hiding spot.

Extensive investigation by the Dayton Police Department, including witness statements and other evidence identified Satterwhite as the principal shooter.

Today, the defendant was indicted on:

- Three counts of Murder
- Two counts of Felonious Assault

All of the counts have mandatory three-year firearm specifications because the defendant used a firearm during the commission of the crimes.

The defendant is currently in custody in the Montgomery County Jail, being held on a detainer issued by the Federal Government on an unrelated case.

Prosecutor Heck continued, "I want to commend the Dayton Police Department for their continued effort in solving this homicide that occurred 10 years ago. The passage of time does not diminish the importance of finding the victim's killer."
