## Sentencings

In June, 2017, we disposed of 255 cases. The Judges sentenced the defendants in those cases as follows:

- 66% received Community Control Sanctions (probation)
- 26% were sentenced to the penitentiary
- 4% were granted Intervention in Lieu of Conviction (ILC)
- 3% received local time or local time plus probation

Some notable sentences:

- 6/2/2017 Jerry V. Ramey, Jr. was sentenced to 15 years-to-life in prison for the murder of Earl E. Davis Jr. by strangulation. On Monday, March 21, 2016, Dayton Police received an anonymous call about a possible dead body at a home on Strand Avenue. After a jury trial, the defendant was found guilty as charged on counts of murder, aggravated burglary, and felonious assault.
- 6/5/2017 Lisa Baker was sentenced to four years at the Ohio Reformatory for Women after being convicted of committing felonious assault on her ex-boyfriend with a motor vehicle. On Saturday, May 28, 2016, Dayton Police and paramedics were dispatched to the 900 block of Neal Avenue on a report of a pedestrian having been struck by a car. After further investigation, police determined the defendant had gotten into the vehicle and purposefully drove it towards the victim, striking him.

- 6/7/2017 Dale Anthony Glenn was sentenced to 21 years-to-life in prison for the shooting death of Michael Mays-Belton in the parking lot of the K-9 Club on Germantown Pike in Jefferson Township. On Wednesday, March 9, 2016, an argument occurred between the victim and the defendant inside the club. The defendant was removed by security, but when the victim exited the building, the defendant shot the victim several times, killing him.
- 6/21/2017 Bryson Williams was sentenced to 26 years-to-life in prison for the shooting death of Terion Dixon on Germantown Street in Dayton on Friday, November 11, 2016. The victim was standing outside a friend's car in the 1700 block of Germantown when the defendant fired several shots across the road, striking and killing the victim.
- 6/28/2017 Daniel G. Schooler was sentenced to 31 years-to-life in prison for the shooting death of his brother, Reverend William B. Schooler. On Sunday, February 28, 2016, the defendant entered the St. Peter's Missionary Baptist Church on Nancy Street in Dayton, and fatally shot the victim during the Sunday morning church service.

### **Teen Girl Indicted in Connection with Hoover Avenue Murder**

#### ***State v. Elexus Dawkins***

#### ***2017-CR-1432/2***

On June 19, 2017, the Montgomery County Grand Jury indicted the 17-year-old defendant on counts including murder, aggravated robbery, and felonious assault. The defendant had been transferred to be tried as an adult.

On Wednesday, May 3, 2017, the defendant, along with an adult co-defendant, 18-year-old Michael J. Wood, planned to rob the victim. The defendant, Dawkins, was performing a sex act on the victim inside a car on Hoover Avenue when the adult defendant, Wood, shot the victim.

The victim attempted to run away, but the adult defendant chased the victim and shot him a second time, killing him. The victim's deceased body was located by first responders.

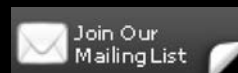
After Prosecutor Heck filed a motion to reconsider *State v. Aalim*, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that the mandatory transfer provided for in the Ohio Revised Code of some cases involving juveniles is constitutional, and therefore the transfer of Dawkins to be tried as an adult was a mandatory transfer.

Prosecutor Heck commented, "[Dawkins] conspired with the adult co-defendant to rob the victim. We asked the court to transfer this defendant to be tried as an adult due to the very serious and deadly consequences of their actions."

The adult co-defendant, Wood, was indicted on May 11, 2017 for his part in the homicide on counts including murder, aggravated robbery, felonious assault, and pandering sexually oriented material involving a minor.
