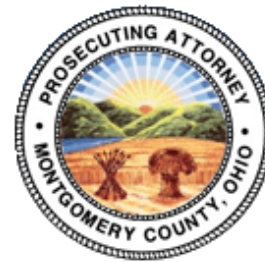


# The Prosecutor's Report

## Sentencings

In February, 2017, we disposed of 251 cases. The Judges sentenced the defendants in those cases as follows:

- 59.7% received Community Control Sanctions (probation)
- 32.7% received a prison sentence
- 3.2% received local time or local time plus probation
- 4.4% were granted Intervention in Lieu of Conviction (ILC)

Some notable sentences:

- 2/1/2017 George Dewberry, Sr. was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole, plus an additional, consecutive 20 years. A jury found Dewberry guilty as charged of aggravated murder, murder, attempted murder, felonious assault and having weapons while under disability. The defendant fatally shot Jesse Pierce on August 20, 2015, who was inside a vehicle. He also shot and seriously injured a female who was also inside the vehicle, but she survived the attack.
- 2/1/2017 Sharon Hancock was sentenced to 11 years in prison for causing the death of his girlfriend's six-week-old daughter, Alisa Albarracin, who died on November 8, 2015 at Dayton Children's Hospital.
- 2/7/2017 Colby D. Riddlebarger was sentenced to four years in prison for robbing The Spot on East Fifth Street in Dayton at knifepoint on October 1, 2015.
- 2/16/2017 Robert Robinson was sentenced to a total of 10 years in prison for committing a home invasion on West Shadyside Drive in Dayton on January 11, 2016.

### **April is Child Abuse Awareness Month**

Nationally, the month of April is set aside as Child Abuse Awareness Month. The statistics on child abuse in our country is shocking. A report of child abuse is made every 10 seconds. More than three million reports of child abuse are made every year. It is estimated that every day, between four and five children die as a direct result of abuse or neglect.

Locally, the Prosecutor's Office is one of five partner agencies at the CARE House, the local Child Advocacy Center. Located near Dayton Children's Hospital, the assistant prosecuting attorneys and victim advocates who work there exclusively

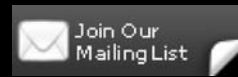
