**Former Oakwood Police Officer Convicted and Sentenced for Theft**

*State v. Frederick Wilson, 2014-CR-3517*

**DAYTON, OH (1/7/2015)** – Prosecutor Mat Heck, Jr. announced today that 47-year-old **Frederick R. Wilson**, of Centerville, has been found guilty of stealing nearly \$100,000 from the Oakwood Fraternal Order of Police. The defendant was sentenced to Community Control Sanctions, and was ordered to serve 30 days in the Montgomery County Jail and perform 180 hours of community service. Additionally, the defendant was ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$99,969.53 to the Oakwood Fraternal Order of Police lodge.

Beginning 2009, the defendant, an Oakwood Police Officer at the time, served as the Treasurer of Oakwood FOP Lodge 107. On June 8, 2014, another officer attempted to use the Lodge's credit card for lodge business and discovered the card had an outstanding balance of \$14,000. Inquiry was made and it was determined that the defendant had stolen from the lodge.

The Lodge hired an accounting firm to audit the organization's finances. That audit determined the defendant stole from the Lodge's checking and savings accounts, and made unauthorized purchases on the Lodge's credit card. The defendant resigned as a police officer from the City of Oakwood on June 9, 2014 and was subsequently removed as treasurer from the lodge.

Prosecutor Heck continued, "This defendant was in a position of trust as a police officer. He took advantage of that trust and stole the lodge's money. It is especially disheartening that a law enforcement officer stole from his fellow officers."
