

ADULT GUARDIANSHIP APPLICATION REVIEW

What is Application Review? Application Review is a service to help applicants identify and correct common issues in applications for adult guardianship before they are filed.

Application Review sessions are 30 minutes long. During a session, a Court employee or volunteer meets with an applicant and reviews the guardianship application. The employee or volunteer identifies common issues and ways to correct those issues. The employee or volunteer does not offer case-specific advice or complete the application for the applicant.

Who may attend Application Review? You may attend Application Review if:

- You are applying to be appointed guardian of an adult who lives in Montgomery County;
- and
- No one else has applied to be appointed guardian of the adult.

Where is Application Review? Application Review is held at Montgomery County Probate Court, 41 North Perry Street, 2nd Floor, Dayton, Ohio 45402.

When is Application Review? Application Review is held on the dates and times listed below, starting February 2018.

- 2nd and 4th Wednesdays: 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Application Review will not be held on Court holidays and may be cancelled due to unavailability of Court employees or volunteers. Applicants who have registered for a session will be notified by telephone or email if the session is cancelled.

How to Register. You are not required to register for Application Review. However, if you do not register, the Court cannot guarantee that a session will be available. You may register for a session by:

What to bring. You must bring your completed Adult Guardianship Application Packet with you to the session.

A final reminder... Please remember that Court employees and volunteers are not allowed to give legal advice. This means that they cannot give you advice that is specific to your case and they cannot complete the guardianship application for you.

If you need case-specific advice, or if you need someone to complete the application for you, you should consult with an attorney who is experienced in guardianship matters.
